The Sacraments



Which Sacraments can be received only once in a lifetime?

Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. These Sacraments imprint an indelible mark on the soul of the Christian. Baptism and Confirmation make him once and for all a child of God and Christlike. Holy Orders similarly leaves and imprint on a Christian man.

Just as someone always is and remains a child of his parents (and not just "sometimes" or "a little bit"), so also through Baptism and Confirmation one becomes forever a child of God, Christlike and a member of his Church. Similarly, Holy Orders is not a "job" that a man does until retirement; rather, it is an irrevocable charism (gift of grace). Because God is faithful, the effect of these sacraments is maintained forever for the Christian—as receptivity to God's call, as a vocation, and a protection. Consequently these sacraments cannot be repeated.

Bishop Daniel Miehm

Bishop Daniel Miehm was born in 1960 in Kitchener, Ontario. After studies at St. Jerome's College, University of Waterloo and St. Augustine's Seminary in Toronto, he was ordained to the Priesthood on May 6, 1989, at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Hamilton. He was ordained Bishop at the Cathedral on May 7/13. Bishop Miehm holds a Master's degree in Divinity from St. Augustine's Seminary and a Licentiate in Canon Law from the University of St. Tomasso (Angelicum) in Rome. Bishop Miehm served as a Priest in the Diocese of Hamilton since his ordination in 1989. During this time, Bishop Miehm had also served as a member and representative on various Councils in the Diocese. From 1996 to 2012, he served as Judge and Defender of the Bond on the Toronto Regional Marriage Tribunal. In June 2012, he was appointed Founding Pastor of St. Benedict Parish in Milton where he was serving at the time of his appointment as Auxiliary Bishop of Hamilton. He was appointed Bishop of Peterborough on Mar 10/17.
