Sunday Mass is at the heart of the Church's life. There we encounter the Risen Lord, we listen to His Word, we are nourished at His table, and thus we become Church.



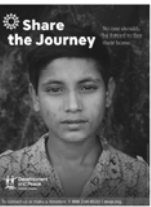
